THE GOD WHO SPEAKS

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales commemorate the anniversaries of Verbum Domini and St. Jerome by dedicating the year 2020 to the Bible under the title "The God Who Speaks"

Verbum Domini (The Word of the Lord) is a post-synodal apostolic exhortation issued by Pope Benedict XVI which deals with how the Catholic church should approach the Bible. He issued it following the XII Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, which had met in October 2008 to discuss "The Word of God in the Life and Mission of the Church." Verbum Domini is dated September 30, 2010, for the Feast of St. Jerome, the patron saint of Biblical studies.

The "God Who Speaks" initiative was announced in February 2019 and takes place in cooperation with the British Bible Society. Several events are scheduled throughout the year to "**celebrate, live and share**" the Word of God.

Two great anniversaries

The year will also serve to commemorate two important anniversaries of Scripture's role in the Church.

2020 will mark the 10th anniversary of Pope Benedict XVI's Apostolic Exhortation Verbum Domini.

It is also the 1,600 anniversary of St. Jerome's death, whose Latin Vulgate translation of the Bible would go on to serve the Western Church up until the last century.

On 30 September 2019, the feast of St. Jerome, the Bishops' initiative will be officially launched, and on 1 December, the First Sunday of Advent, the campaign year begins.

"Celebrating, living and sharing the Word"

In order to shape the resources and events of the year, the Bishops of England and Wales invite Catholics and all who are interested to take part in a survey on how they use Scripture in their daily lives. What the Bishops have said is that the events and resources will be centred around three themes in approaching the Word of God: **celebrating, living and sharing**.

Parishes throughout the country are invited to reflect on how they celebrate, live and share the Word, and to ask themselves where to improve so as to "achieve transformation in our hearts and in our communities".

WHAT WE WILL BE DOING IN OUR PARISH OF ST THOMAS

Our parish is blessed to have a Scripture Group (see page 18) and a Parish Liturgy Group (see page 12) who in different ways are already exploring how God speaks to us through the Scriptures.

We want to invite even more people into looking at how we, as a parish, are
“Celebrating, living and sharing the Word”
in our daily and spiritual lives. In what good ways do we celebrate God's word? Where might there be gaps? Is anyone excluded? What new ways and opportunities might be open to us?

We celebrate God's word by:

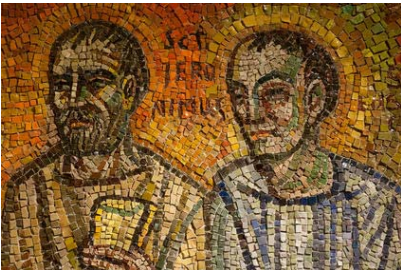
- Reading at Mass with confidence and understanding.
- Leading the Liturgy of the Word with children with imagination and faith.
- Praying with Scripture and reflection in our daily routine.

So we can live God's word by:

- Cherishing life at every stage.
- Using and sharing our resources fairly.
- Protecting the weak, the poor and the marginalised.

We share God's word by:

- Witnessing to Christ in word and action.
- Reaching out to others.
- Forming disciples who know and love God.



We will be holding special evenings to do this in Advent 2019 and Lent 2020.

We will be asking people to let us know what they would like to do to explore how we could celebrate, live and share God's word amongst us.

Sharing the Gospel through our Worship

Celebrating Holy Mass on a Saturday Evening and Sunday is the one moment of the week that truly brings us all together as a Catholic Community. It is the source and summit of the Christian life. Here are the Ministries that help make this a special occasion for us all.

Who & What	When
<p>1. Our Altar Servers Serving in the sanctuary during mass is a great privilege and honour. Like priests and deacons, the altar server is serving not only Our Lord but also the People of God, the parish community. Boys and girls who have celebrated their First Communion and are regular members of the St Thomas' parish community are welcome to join the altar servers. Altar servers are required for all the Sunday masses, including the Vigil. Duties include cross-bearer, candle bearers (acolytes), thurifer and boat server.</p> <p><u>NEW MEMBERS NEEDED</u> Teenagers and adults are all welcome to join. Anyone who wishes to serve at either of the weekday masses is especially welcome. Regular attendance at Mass is expected, arriving 15min-20min before mass commences. Training will be given. <p>2. Eucharistic Ministers Extraordinary Ministers for the distribution of Holy Communion are properly formed, instructed and commissioned lay persons. EMHCs may be male or female. These ministers are appointed for a given parish community to aid in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass and to the sick and homebound when ordinary ministers of Holy Communion are unavailable. <u>New Ministers are always welcome.</u> Contact email: canterbury@rcaos.org.uk</p>	<p>All Year</p>
<p>3. Readers Reading the holy scriptures during the first half of the mass, the Liturgy of the Word, is a vitally important part of the entire mass. It is the Reader and not the priest or a deacon who proclaims the Word in the first and second readings on a Sunday: the Reader is the authorised layperson for this role. It is a privilege to proclaim the Word of God since Catholics believe that Christ himself is present in the Word, since it is Christ himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in church. As the CTS leaflet "Being a Reader at Mass" states: "Do remember, being a reader at Mass is a service to the liturgy, the Church and community, and requires a spirit of humility and fidelity, for which we should pray." <p>4. Parish Liturgy Group The word "liturgy" comes from Greek and means "public service" or the work of the people. It is used to describe all the public acts of worship that take place, as it draws people into the work of God. <p>1. Baptism Preparation Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life and the gateway to the life of the Spirit. It is the door that gives access to the other sacraments. It is always a great joy when children of the parish are brought forward for Baptism. Baptisms are usually celebrated on a Sunday at 12.15 or during a Sunday Mass. Please fill an enquiry form - available through our website or at the back of the Church if you want your child baptised. There is a preparation session for parents once a month. <p>4. Confirmation Programme Baptism, the sacrament of Confirmation and the Eucharist constitute the 'sacraments of Christian initiation.' Confirmation represents the completion of baptismal grace: by confirmation, the baptised are 'more perfectly bound to the Church and are enriched with a special strength of the Holy Spirit' (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1285). In short, the sacrament of confirmation completes the sacrament of baptism: it is a coming of age. Here in the Parish, the confirmation formation programme runs from New Year to Pentecost, meeting on Sunday afternoons from 4-5.30pm. Application forms will be available from Autumn Term 2019. 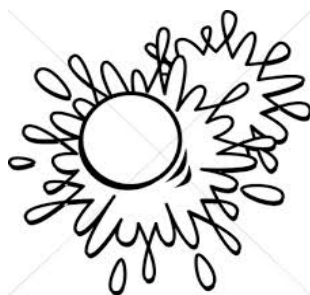


Deepening our Faith

Becket 2020

Each year on 7th July, our parish celebrates the Translation of the Body of St Thomas of Canterbury Mass. On Tuesday, 7th July, 1220, the body of St Thomas, which had been kept in the crypt of Canterbury Cathedral since the saint's martyrdom on Tuesday, 29th December, 1170, was translated to an imposing new shrine behind the high altar of the cathedral, in the Trinity Chapel, where it remained until its complete destruction by King Henry VIII (1491-1547) in 1538.

On the occasion of the Translation in 1220, some Cardinals and bishops from abroad were present as witnesses, and they took the opportunity of removing some small relics for themselves. The reliquary in our Martyr's Chapel, before 1953, contained two relics of our patron: a piece of St Thomas' vestment and a piece of bone from his body. These came from Gubbio in Umbria, Italy, and were presented to St Thomas' Church by Mary Hales over one hundred years ago. The pedigree of the relics is well authenticated. The third relic, a piece of the saint's finger, was presented to us in 1953 by the Prior of Chevetogne, Father Thomas Becquet, a collateral descendant of the martyred archbishop.

In recent years we have celebrated Mass in the quire of Canterbury Cathedral each 7th July. Next year, 2020, will be the 850th anniversary of the assassination of St Thomas and the 800th anniversary of the Translation. On this occasion there will be many special events organised to celebrate the feast. A tunic belonging to St Thomas of Canterbury will be brought from Rome.

The Cathedral is holding special commemoration events on the weekend of 4th and 5th July 2020. There will be a special evensong which is hoped to be celebrated in the presence of the Archbishop of Canterbury and Cardinal Vincent Nichols. We would like to mark the celebration of Mass on the actual day (Tuesday 7th 2020 at 8pm) in a very special way. We are already planning who to ask to preside and preach and looking at the music and liturgy to be used.

Please put the date in your diary so we can make it a wonderful Parish Event.
